kitchen

- → Paper towels
- → Dish soap
- → Dishwasher detergent gel
- → Paper bags (small & large)
- → Unflavored applesauce
- → Ziploc bags (quart & gallon size)
- → Tupperware containers (20+ cup capacity)
- → Kitchen knives
- → Kitchen scissors
- → Fruit: peaches, apricots, oranges, apples, cherries, etc.

 (Please no lemons or limes.)

laundry / closet

- → Unscented high efficiency (HE) laundry soap
- → Shoe boxes with lids
- → Gently used t-shirts
- → Gently used towels and washcloths (any size)
- → Gently used sheets
- → Large laundry baskets

home & garden

- → Orchard grass or timothy hay
- → Vegetables from your garden
- → Fruit from your fruit trees
- → Gift cards to:

pet supplies

- → Cat scratching posts (small & large)
- → Kaytee Exact Hand Feeding Baby Bird formula

bathroom

- → Unscented tissues
- → Hand soap
- → Toilet paper
